5.1.3 Lee Hesketh, BC Cattleman's Association, Farmland-Riparian Interface Stewardship Program: Finding Common Ground

5.1.4 Question and Answer, and Discussion

Water Source Protection refers to the management of land based activities that will impact all sources of water at any point in the watershed.

The Memorandum of Understanding Regarding Inter-Agency Accountability and Coordination of Drinking Water Protection (MOU) is intended to promote sharing of information and reflect a sense of partnership and shared responsibility for drinking water protection and risk management.

Discussion ensued regarding potential threats including cattle, pathogens, and arsenic to drinking water quality. Lee Hesketh invited all members to a presentation regarding ecoli to be held at the Vernon Lodge on March 07, 2007.

Studies have confirmed that wildlife, septic fields and cattle were significant contributors threatening the quality of drinking water.

Ranchers are frustrated with the lack of funding and are requesting additional communication, education and technical support to deal with the matter.

Members expressed concern that Water Suppliers are responsible

for funding of assessments on multi-use crown lands but have no power over controlling activities on those lands. Suggestions included supporting water suppliers in assessments and / or looking at water management plans with a portion of OWSC funds.

Smaller creeks need to be monitored along with the rest of the watershed to ensure protection of source water.

Chair Siddon stressed the importance of changing political attitudes and urging the provincial politicians to address the concern of source water protection.

Members agreed to follow-up on the matter at the February 08, 2007 OWSC meeting.

5.2 Matters Arising from January 09, 2007 OBWB Meeting

John Slater, Chair of the Okanagan Basin Water Board stated that the OBWB recognized the value of the Council and that they looked forward to the Council taking their position to the politicians and the public.

The OBWB agreed to the recommendations from the Council regarding Hydrometric Monitoring however requested that recommendations regarding Water Use Monitoring and Metering be revised.

Valerie Cameron exited the meeting at 4:27 p.m.
