## 5. <u>REPORTS FROM STAFF</u>

- 1.1. OBWB Board Report(s)
  - 1.1.1. Water Conservation and Quality Improvement Grants

Ms. Dunbar explained to the council that she presented the Water Conservation and Quality Improvement Grant recommendations to the Okanagan Basin Water Board at the last board meeting April 1, 2008 and they were approved as submitted.

She further explained that there are 27 projects in total. This is an increase over 14 from 2007 due to the additional \$200,000 in funding received for 2008. In the summary provided to Council it describes the approved grants and allocation of funds for each regional district in the Okanagan.

#### 1.1.2. UBC – Okanagan Reservoir Chair

Dr. Sears stated that she submitted a memo to the Okanagan Basin Water Board at the board meeting April 1, 2008. It explains that UBC-O received \$1.25 million in funding for the establishment of a UBC-O Chair in Reservoir Ecosystem Management through the Leading Edge Endowment Fund (LEEF). To receive these funds, UBC-O must obtain a matching contribution. Dr. Sears explained that one way to accomplish this is to approach local municipalities for resolutions of support and another is that the OBWB work with the Federal Government to obtain funding.

The Council was invited to make suggestions for research questions of high importance to the local community.

## 6. PRESENTATIONS

#### 6.1 Okanagan Reservoir Lease Lots

Lake Country Mayor James Baker and Kelowna City Councilor Brian Given spoke to the Council to provide an update regarding the sale of the Okanagan reservoir lease lots.

Councilor Given explained that he spoke with Agriculture and Lands Minister Pat Bell about this issue and was told that Minister Bell is prepared to halt the process and speak with the Okanagan Basin Water Board and the Okanagan Mayors before moving forward with the sale.

## 6.2 Okanagan First Nation Governance

Mr. Jatel explained that an important part of the Okanagan Water Strategy is to recognize and respect Aboriginal water rights. Aboriginal title, Aboriginal rights and treaty rights have been recognized on paper through our Constitution and in legal decisions but the extent of these rights are still being defined. Many activities that are protected as Aboriginal rights are closely tied to water such as fishing, hunting, gathering, and spiritual practices. We all share this valley and the water resources contained within our watershed. The developing Sustainable Water Strategy will highlight that it is in our best interest to support an open dialogue with the Okanagan First Nation as a senior partner and action water management and conservation practices that are of benefit to all concerned.

## 6.3 Groundwater Proposal – Scott Schillereff, EBA Consulting

Scott Schillereff of EBA Consulting gave the Council a presentation on a regional Okanagan subsurface database. He explained that the original concept came from the Kelowna Joint Water Committee who are interested in knowing the location, nature, and use of wells or boreholes intersecting aquifers in the Okanagan for better understanding and management of groundwater resources.

The proposed concept of is to capture records of all pertinent wells or boleholes in a regional Okanagan subsurface database., tie reporting to the development permit process, use electronic reporting/database entry and possibly link with existing MoE online well database.

Mr. Schillereff explained there are four phases to this project:

**Phase 1** – Concept Development and Endorsement (2008) = consult local governments, define database, scope IT process, define ownership, go/no-go milestone

**Phase 2** – Database Construction = construct database/GIS, establish web-based systems & processes; database manager and web location in place

**Phase 3** – Pilot Test in Central Okanagan = year-long pilot phase in Kelowna area; road test process; explore linkages with other databases; interpretive layers

**Phase 4** – Implement in Entire Okanagan = roll-out to northern and southern Okanagan; ROSD coupled with other databases with public access
