Okanagan Basin Water Board Meeting Highlights

Water Board works with utilities on drought triggers: The board was updated on an OBWB workshop held this week with large utilities that draw water for customers from the Okanagan's mainstem (valley-bottom) lakes. The partners are looking to develop consistent drought triggers based on lake levels that will help set water restrictions in times of shortages. These drought triggers would form part of each utility's drought response plans.

Board sets priorities for 2018 water project grants: Directors approved priorities for its Water Conservation and Quality Improvement (WCQI) 2018 Grant Program. Priorities include Drought and Flood Preparedness, Mapping, Water Quality, and Source Protection. Categories that will also be considered include Education, Irrigation, Groundwater Studies, Metering, System Improvement, Water Treatment Studies, Water Management Planning, Xeriscape, Water Flow Monitoring and Restoration. Those eligible to apply for up to \$30,000 include local governments, improvement districts and non-profits. Details will be available next week on the OBWB website at www.OBWB.ca/wcqi.

Directors approve 2017-18 OBWB budget: The board adopted the budget for the upcoming fiscal year, April 1, 2018 - March 31, 2019, at 4.8 cents/\$1,000 assessed value, down from 5.3 cents in the current year due to higher assessment values. The \$3.45 million budget includes the Watermilfoil Control Program, Sewerage Facilities Grants Program, and the Water Management Program (which includes water research, the WCQI Grant Program, and communications and outreach through the Okanagan WaterWise Program).

Strong interest in Okanagan river documentary: The two initial screenings of "The River Film" were very successful with several requests for more screenings. Additional events are being organized and DVD copies will be made available to community groups and schools in December.
