WHAT WE DO

The Okanagan Basin Water Board addresses water issues that cross community boundaries by providing information to decision makers and working toward agreements that protect the resource for everyone.

We provide the following essential functions:

- Implementing basin-wide water management programs
- Advocating and representing local needs to senior government
- Providing science-based information on Okanagan water
- Communicating and coordinating between local governments and other stakeholders
- Building funding opportunities



EURASIAN WATERMILFOIL MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

The Eurasian Watermilfoil Management Program focuses on removing aquatic weeds in winter (rototilling) and cutting stems in summer (harvesting). The goal of the program is to reduce the density of weeds so they do not interfere with public enjoyment of lakes, or negatively impact aquatic ecosystems.



SEWAGE FACILITIES GRANT PROGRAM

The Sewage Facilities Grant Program provides funding for municipalities to upgrade or replace sewage treatment facilities or extend community sewers. The goal of the program is to reduce nutrient input to Okanagan mainstem lakes from wastewater discharges.

WATER MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

The Water Management Program connects the dots between the people, the information, the policies and the plans we need to protect water in the Okanagan.

The program includes:

- Water Conservation & Quality
 Improvement Grant Program
- Water Stewardship Council (technical advisory council to the Board)
- Water Science (including the Water Supply & Demand Project)
- Communication & Outreach (including the Sustainable Water Strategy)
