



Discussion on Future of Okanagan Water with Renowned Speaker

It's being referred to as an eye-popping educational talk on the future of water in the Okanagan at Penticton's Okanagan College campus.

World-renowned water advisor Robert Sandford is speaking on Tuesday, November 19, at 7 p.m. at its free to attend.

Sandford's goal is to help people to understand changing weather patterns, ramifications of our destabilized jet streams and related severe events happening worldwide.

Soil Scientist Scott Smith from the Pacific Agra Research facility in Summerland will also speak. Smith will provide a region-wide cross section of exactly what is beneath our feet and how it will behave in extreme weather events, be it flood or drought.
