This weekend, hundreds of people will be in Kelowna competing in the 9th annual dragon boat festival.

Races will be held in City Park on Saturday and Sunday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Along with the dragon boat races, there will be talks, drummers and lion dancers performing.

Kelowna Dragon Boat Society president Becky Marks recently spoke with the Daily Courier about the popularity of dragon boating, tips for new dragon boaters and how each teammate chooses their seat in the boat based on their specific skills.

COURIER: How many people are expected to participate in the upcoming dragon boat festival in Kelowna?

MARKS: We expect 600 athletes or 24 teams.

COURIER: How popular has dragon boating become in Kelowna over the years? How many people are in the local club?

MARKS: We have over 230 members in our club. There are also 50 members in the Okanagan Dragon Boat Racing Club and two other teams of 20 practicing out of the Westside.

COURIER: When did you first get into dragon boating, and how did you get into it?

MARKS: I have been paddling for 15 years. I first got into it because my daughter's best friend's mom introduced me to the sport.

COURIER: What is your favourite part about dragon boating?

MARKS: The team dynamic.

COURIER: What is the secret to a successful dragon boat race?

MARKS: Having 22 hearts beating as one.

COURIER: What is the most difficult part of a race?

MARKS: The end is the most difficult, but it is also the most rewarding. Coach's motto, "Leave it on the Water."

COURIER: Dragon boating seems to attract mainly women. Is this true? And if so, why is that?

MARKS: Dragon boating began over 2,500 years ago in China. Nearly 20 years ago it became very popular with the breast cancer survivors.

Specialists believed it would benefit their health and social well being. It is slowly becoming more popular for both mixed teams and men's teams.

Dragon boat racing is now in over 60 countries in the world and has over 50 million dragon boaters worldwide.

COURIER: Does every dragon boater have a specific place on the boat they like to sit?

MARKS: Paddlers are placed in different spots at the beginning of the season and then placed in the row that benefits the team. Stronger paddlers are in the middle of the boat.

Those with great timing are placed in the front and the best cardio paddlers are placed at the back.

COURIER: How often do teams train together before an event such as the Kelowna dragon boat festival?

MARKS: Most teams paddle two times per week starting in May and racing until September. In an average year, those teams practice more than 35 times.

COURIER: What tips or advice do you have for someone wanting to get into dragon boating?

MARKS: Come out and give it a try. It is a sport designed for all ages and fitness levels. It is a great way to meet people and become connected with the water community.

More money needed for fight against mussels

The battle against invasive aquatic mussels needs more financial help from the federal government, the Okanagan Basin Water Board says.

Ottawa recently pledged \$157,000 annually over three years to support efforts to prevent zebra and quagga mussels from infesting B.C. waters.
